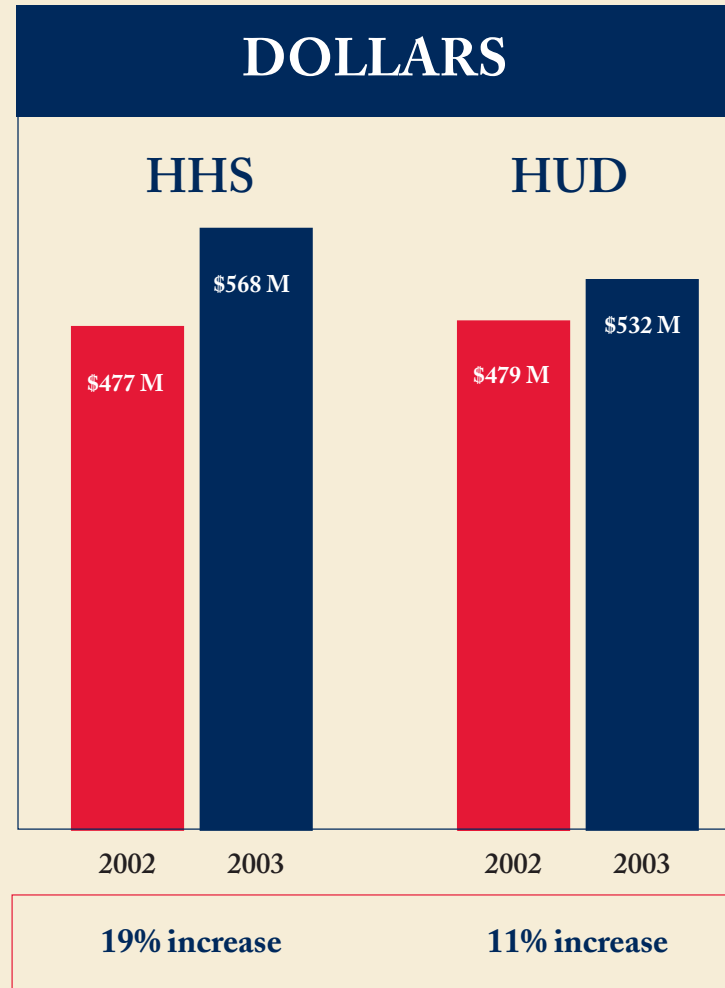
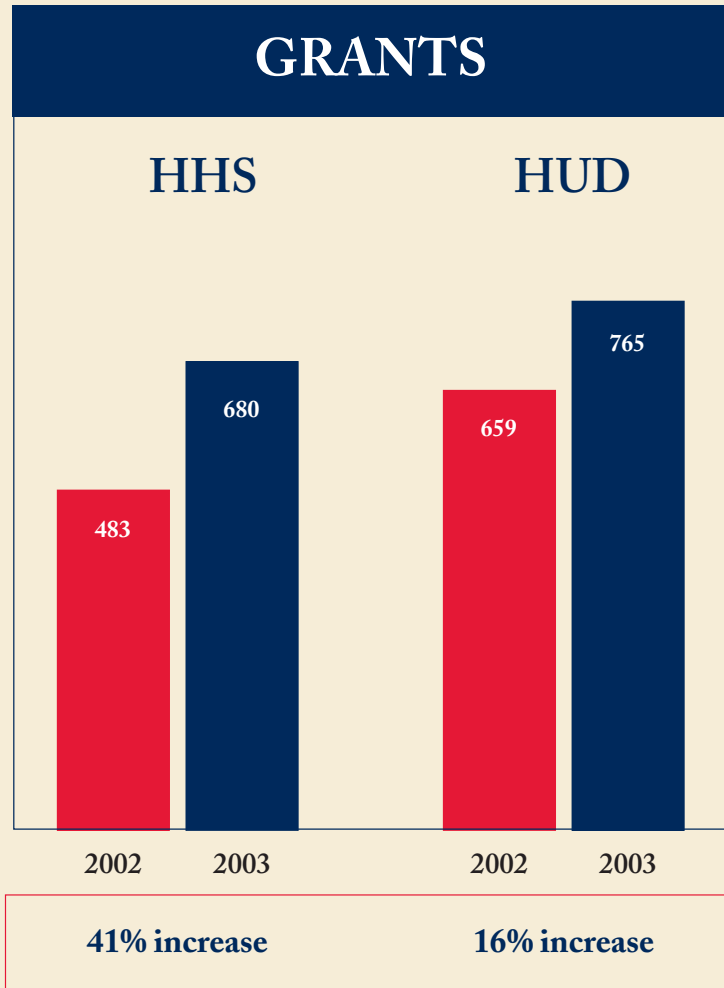

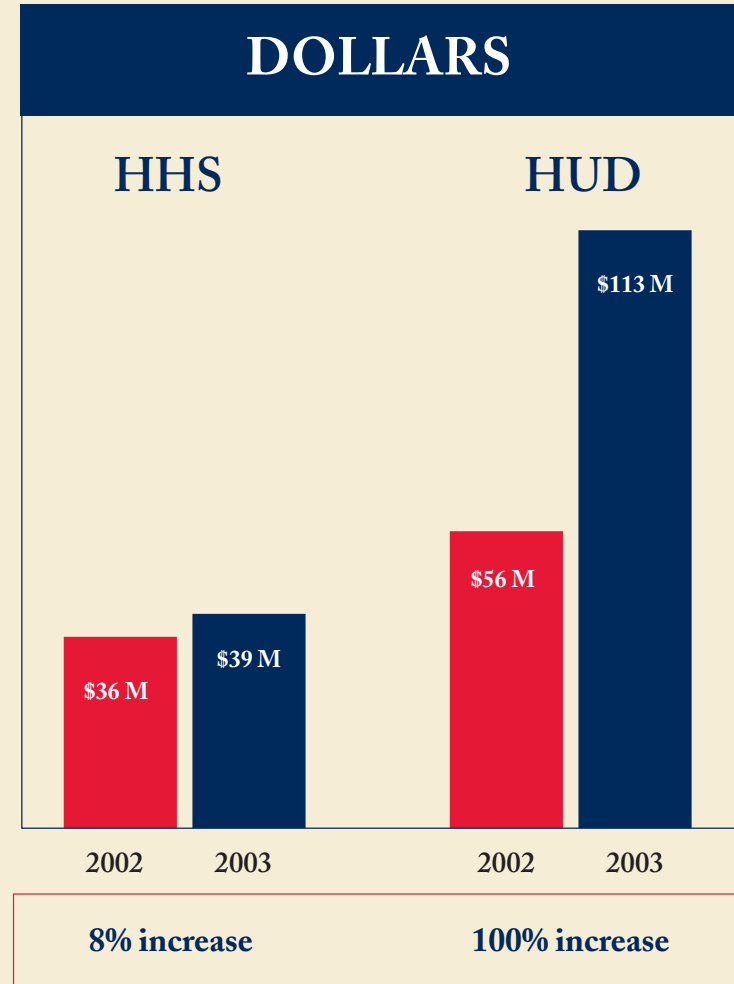
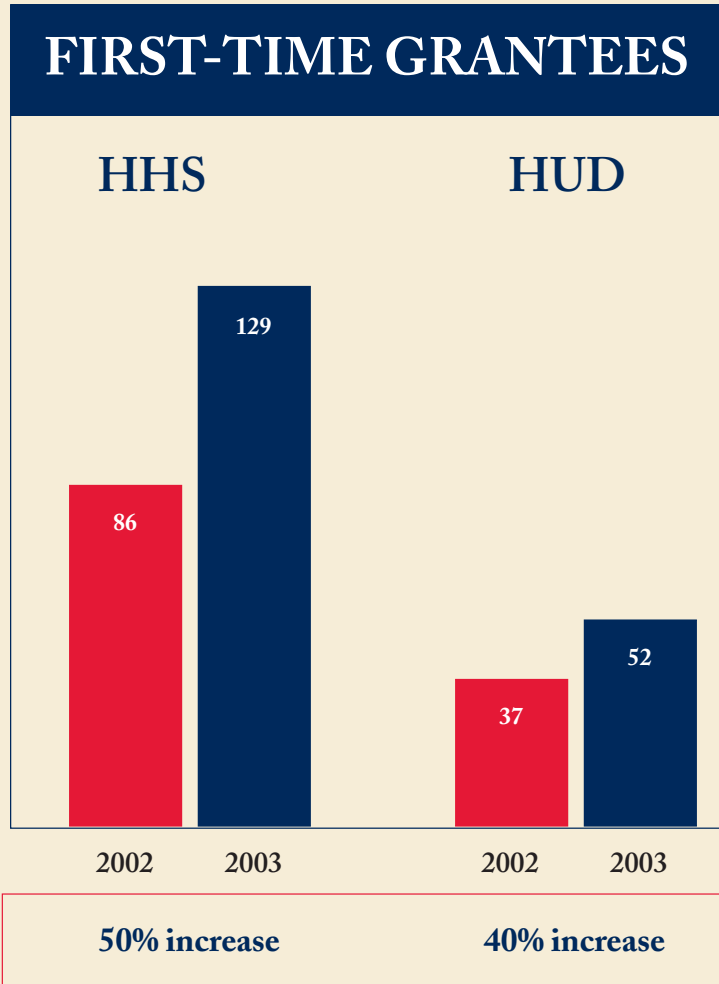

INDICATORS OF PROGRESS

HHS:

- awarded 680 grants to faith-based organizations (FBOs) in FY03, an increase of 41% from FY02
- \$91 million increase in funds going to FBOs in FY03 – a 19% increase
- 50% increase in first-time grantees in FY03

HUD:

- awarded 765 grants to FBOs in FY03, an increase of 16% from FY02
- \$53 million increase in funds going to FBOs in FY03 – an 11% increase
- 40% increase in first-time grantees in FY03
- more than half of Section 202 Elderly Housing funding (\$316 million) went to FBOs

ED:

- 2% of 771 approved Supplemental Services providers (organizations that provide tutoring under “No Child Left Behind”) were FBOs in January 2003 – by December, 9% of 1046 providers were FBOs

Summary:

- A review of \$14.5 billion in Federal competitive non-formula programs in FY03 at five agencies showed that \$1.17 billion went to FBOs
- HHS and HUD had a combined increase of \$144 million in FY03
