Subject: FCC rulemaking regarding Ultra-wide band devices

To Whom it May Concern

The Federal Communications Commission is about to publish new regulations which will put my company, and many other small businesses like mine, out of business. Our businesses use Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR), a technique that we have used for the past 25 years to inspect the condition of roads and bridges, locate underground pipes and utilities, conduct safety inspections of structures for faults and potential failures, locate groundwater and bedrock, and map contaminants. In spite of the fact that our equipment transmits into the ground, and has never interfered with any communications system, the FCC seems to feel that our operation might be undesirable.

We feel that the new FCC rules are ill advised and lose sight of their real mission and its impact. The FCC should address real problems with communications systems. They should not be shutting down small businesses and eliminating jobs on speculation when a problem does not really exist!
